

large community of Japanese Americans had developed in Hawaii before World War II, and immigration from Japan to Hawaii resumed after the war. When Hawaii became a state in 1959, Japanese Americans became an important political force in all levels of government. This was especially true after the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, also known as the McCar-

ran-Walter Act, allowed the Issei, or first-generation Japanese immigrants, to become citizens. Before long, half the members of Hawaii's legislature were Japanese Americans. Hawaiians also sent Spark Matsunaga, Patsy Takemoto Mink, and Daniel Inouye to Congress in Washington, D.C.

Both Matsunaga and Inouye had won Purple Hearts in World War II as members of the famous 442nd Army

Battalion made up of Japanese Americans, and both men later served as commanders of the Disabled American Veterans in Hawaii. Daniel Inouye was first elected to the U.S. Senate in 1962. Spark Matsunaga served several terms in the House of Representatives before being elected to the Senate in 1976.
